

**“ 4. Other Officers Entered on or after 1st May 1957.**

Officers other than General Officers, first entered as Second Lieutenant, Royal Marines or first commissioned as Officers of the Royal Marines on or after 1st May 1957, are to be compulsorily retired on reaching the ages set out below:

**WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1959**

**LAUNDRY WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)**

It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.
