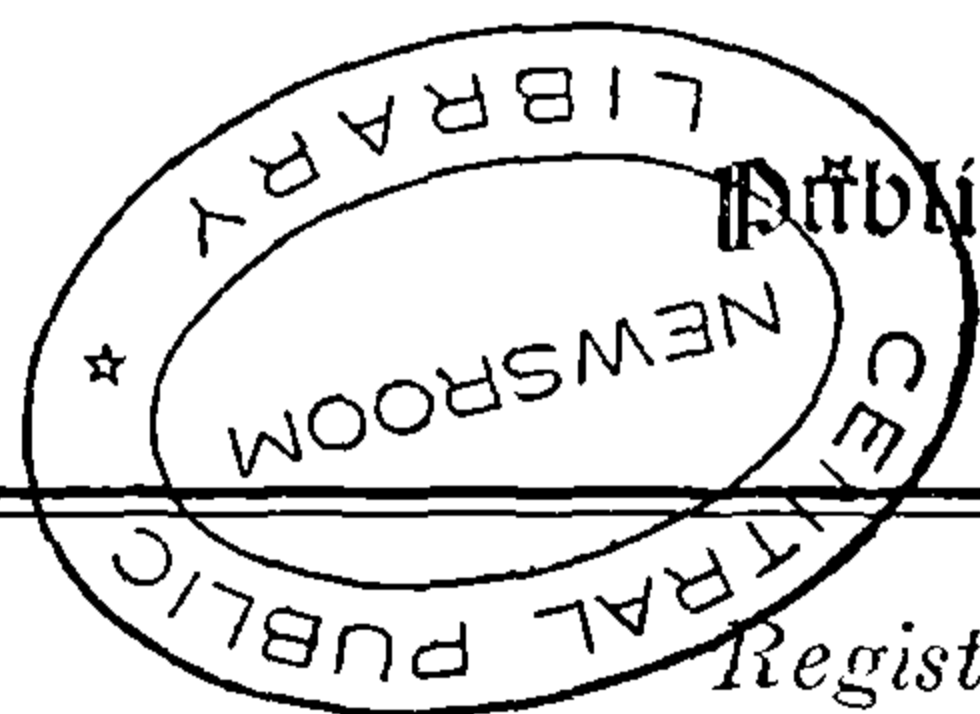

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946
SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949
NEWHOUSE TO BAILLIESTON SIDE ROADS
IMPROVEMENTS

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make two Orders under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, to provide for (a) the improvement by realignment and regrading of lengths of Bo'ness Road, Woodhall Mill Road, Woodhall Cottage Road, Bellshill Road, North Road, Drumpark Road, Braehead Mill Road and Old Monkland Road near Coatbridge in the County of Lanark, (b) the construction by the Secretary of State of thirteen new roads in substitution for the roads authorised to be stopped up by the Orders so as to improve the junctions of the trunk road with the side roads at Newhouse Industrial Estate, Shawhead Roundabout and Rosebank House, (c) the stopping up of lengths of Woodhall Mill Road, Woodhall Cottage Road, North Road, Bellshill Road, Drumpark Road, Braehead Mill Road, and Bredisholm Road when the new roads are opened for the purposes of through traffic, (d) the stopping up of parts of Carnbroe Road, Kirkshaws Road, Old Monkland Road and Bredisholm Road and (e) the Lanark County Council becoming the highway authority for the new roads on the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the Council that the new roads are opened for through traffic.

VARIATION OF ROUTE OF BERRIEDALE
DIVERSION

DECLARATIONS OF BEN LUI, CAENLOCHAN AND INVERPOLLY NATURE RESERVES

NOTICE is Hereby Given, in pursuance of Section 19 of the above mentioned Act, that by the Ben Lui Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961, the Caenlochan Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961 and the Inverpolly Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961 all made on the 27th day of April 1961 it was declared by the Nature Conservancy that the lands (First), (Second), (Third), (Fifth), (Sixth) and (Seventh) hereinafter described are now the subjects of Agreements entered into with them under the provisions of the Act, and the land (Fourth) hereinafter described has been acquired and is being held by them,

namely:

(First) Land extending to 925 acres or thereby comprising part of the Farm of Cononish in the Parish of Killin and County of Perth.

Which Land (First) above mentioned is shown tinted pink and enclosed within a red line on the map attached to the Ben Lui Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961.

(Second) Land extending to 6.847 acres or thereby comprising part of the Airlie Estates in the Parishes of Glenisla and of Cortachy and Clova and County of Angus.

(Third) Land extending to 1,385 acres or thereby comprising parts of the estates of Invercauld in the Parish of Crathie and Braemar and County of Aberdeen and of Glenshee in the Parish of Kirkmichael and County of Perth.

(Fourth) Lands extending to 759 acres or thereby comprising part of the Glen Doll Forest in the Parish of Cortachy and Clova and County of Angus.
