TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

## BURGH OF PORTSOY

## Extension of Burgh Boundaries

IN connection with an Initial Writ presented by The Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the Burgh of Portsoy to the Sheriff of Aberdeen, Kincardine and Banff, at Banff, for the extension of the boundaries of the Burgh the Sheriff has made the following deliverance:

"Banff, 15th May 1961. The Sheriff, having resumed consideration of the foregoing Initial Writ, and relative productions, and considered the proof adduced, in respect that after due intimation no party has appeared to object or to be heard in reference thereto, and being satisfied that the additional area proposed to be included within the Burgh of Portsoy ought to form part of said Burgh and that the extension hereinafter specified is reasonable and ought to be granted, Therefore Alters and Extends as from 16th May 1961, the boundaries of the Burgh of Portsoy; and Appoints the following to be the new boundaries of the said Burgh—namely, the existing boundaries as indicated by a broken line in black on the map produced and referred to with the alterations as indicated by the broken lines in red on the said map, the said alterations to include within the said Burgh the three areas of ground coloured pink on the said map and the said alterations measuring as follows:

*First (Campbell Hospital) Area*—from the south west corner of the existing burgh boundary at The New Playing Field in a straight line north westwards a distance of four hundred and forty-three feet or thereby, then northwards a distance of nine hundred and twelve feet or thereby and finally eastwards a distance of one hundred and thirty-five feet or thereby to join the existing burgh boundary at the north of Campbell Hospital; *Second (Durn Road) Area*—from the south west corner of the existing burgh boundary in a straight line south eastwards a distance of seven hundred and thirteen feet or thereby, then north eastwards a distance of five hundred and forty-seven feet or thereby, then north westwards a distance of three hundred and fifty-one feet or thereby and finally north eastwards a distance of twenty-six feet or thereby to join the existing burgh boundary; and *Third (Aird Street) Area*—from the existing burgh



boundary at Aird Bridge along the line of the north side of the road to Langside a distance of five hundred and sixty-five feet or thereby, then southwards a distance of eight hundred and forty-eight feet or thereby and finally westwards a distance of six hundred and twenty-three feet or thereby to join the existing burgh boundary; and grants warrant to record the Initial Writ and this deliverance in the Books of Court and the Minute Book of the Pursuers."
