ROYAL BURGH OF CUPAR
 EXTENSION OF BURGH BOUNDARY

ROYAL BURGH OF LINLITHGOW
 EXTENSION OF BURGH BOUNDARIES

NOTICE is hereby given that an Application has been presented to the Sheriff of the Lothians and Peebles at Linlithgow, at the instance of the Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the Royal Burgh of Linlithgow, craving the Court to revise, alter and extend the boundaries of said Burgh so as (a) to include (1) that area of land, as delineated and coloured blue on the Twenty-five inch Ordnance Survey Map (1953 Edition) presently in the office of the Sheriff Clerk at Linlithgow, and bounded as follows, namely: By a line commencing at a point on the existing Burgh boundary where it crosses the eastern boundary of enclosure No. 3151 on said Ordnance Survey Map and following in a straight line in a northerly direction the said eastern boundary of said enclosure No. 3151 and thereafter the eastern boundary of enclosure No. 2563 on said Ordnance Survey Map to a point 30 feet or thereby along said last mentioned boundary line; thence in a straight line in an easterly direction across enclosure No. 4166 and the Linlithgow-Bonness Road (A706) and thereafter along the northern boundary of the Parkhead Farm road to the south-west corner of enclosure No. 7974 on said Ordnance Survey Map; thence in a straight line in a southerly direction across said Parkhead Farm road and thereafter along the western boundary of enclosure No. 8158 on said Ordnance Survey Map to the point where said western boundary meets the watermark of Linlithgow Loch at surface water level 150.72 feet Ordnance Datum 11th November 1948, on said Ordnance Survey Map and thence following the said watermark of said Linlithgow Loch in a westerly direction for a distance of 380 feet or thereby until the existing Burgh boundary is reached; (2) that area of land lying to the North-East of the Burgh and bounded as follows, namely: By a line commencing at a point on the existing Burgh boundary where it reaches its northeastmost point on the said watermark of said Linlithgow Loch and following the said watermark in a northerly direction for a distance of 40 feet or thereby; thence in an easterly direction in a straight line to a point on the eastern boundary of the Linlithgow-Upper Bonnytown Road 200 feet or thereby north of its junction with the Linlithgow-Blackness Road B.903; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said Linlithgow-Upper Bonnytown Road to the centre of said junction; thence in a north easterly direction along the northern boundary of said Linlithgow-Blackness Road to a point thereon opposite the eastern boundary of enclosure No. 0871 on said Ordnance Survey Map; thence in a south-easterly direction in a straight line across said Linlithgow-Blackness Road and along the whole length of the eastern boundaries of enclosures Nos. 0871 and 1556 respectively on said Ordnance Survey Map, thereafter in a southerly direction along the whole length of the eastern boundary of enclosure No. 2742 and from thence projected in a straight line in a southerly direction across the main Edinburgh-Glasgow Railway line
