PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas the Secretary of State for Scotland has, in pursuance of the powers competent to him under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855(a), made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor dated 24th November 1960, given by the Sheriff of the Lothians and Peebles at Haddington, finding that the Burial Ground in the Chapel Yard at Elphinstone in the Parish of Tranent and the County of East Lothian is in a condition which is offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that, in terms of section 5 of the said Act, burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Burial Ground, subject to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned:

And Whereas by an Order in Council of the 27th day of February 1961, Notice of such Representation was given and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 28th day of April 1961, and that the said Order, or notice thereof, should be published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and that copies of the said Order or notice should be fixed on the doors of the Chapel at Elphinstone, or on some other conspicuous places within the Parish of Tranent in the County of East Lothian one month before the said 28th day of April 1961:

And Whereas Notice of the said Representation and of the time when the same was ordered to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council has been duly published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and fixed in manner required by the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. That in terms of section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, burials be forthwith discontinued in the Burial Ground in the Chapel Yard at Elphinstone in the Parish of Tranent and the County of East Lothian except for the burial of:

- 1) any person whose husband or wife has been buried in the said Burial Ground;
- (2) any person whose child has been buried in the said Burial Ground;
- 3 any unmarried person who, at the date of the closure of the said Burial Ground, was over forty years of age and had at that date a parent buried in the said Burial Ground; and

- (4) cremated remains of any person who, but for the closure of the said Burial Ground, would be entitled to burial in a lair given off prior to the date of closure:

Provided always that such burials can be carried out without being dangerous to public health or offensive or contrary to decency and without interference with the remains of a previous burial, that proper and sufficient ground is available in the respective family burial ground, that no such burial except the burial of cremated human remains shall be made unless the coffin can be laid at a depth of not less than four feet from the surface of the ground to the upper surface of the coffin, and that intimation be given to the Burial Grounds Officer of the County of East Lothian not later than the day preceding that on which a grave is to be opened.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Scotland) (Chapel Yard, Elphinstone Burial Ground) Order, 1961.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the person, whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
