At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th day of June 1962

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, 28 & 29 Vict. c. 73, it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council.

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient further to amend the Order concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows and children of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949, relating to officers, nurses and ratings as therein defined, shall be further amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order.

1. In Article 10 as amended by Order of the 27th November 1957, (which provides for the award of allowances for part-time treatment) for the figures 40s. there shall be substituted the figures 50s. and the words and figures "(subject to a maximum payment of 65s. in respect of any one week)" shall be omitted.

2. This Order shall be construed as one with the Order in Council of the 29th September 1949, as amended by any subsequent Order, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 16th May 1962.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined, shall be further amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order.

1. In Article 22 as amended by Order of the 27th November 1957, (which provides for the award of allowances for part-time treatment) for the figures 40s. there shall be substituted the figures 50s. and the words and figures "(subject to a maximum payment of 65s. in respect of any one week)" shall be omitted.

2. This Order shall be construed as one with the Order in Council of the 29th September 1949, as amended by any subsequent Order, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 16th May 1962.
