## TRUNK ROADS ACTS 1936 and 1946 REVOCATION OF PART OF THE NORTH OF CUMBERNAULD TO HAGGS DIVERSION ORDER

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made an Order under section 11 of the Trunk Roads Act 1946 and section 13 of the Trunk Roads Act 1936 both as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955, the effect of which is that the Gretna-Stranraer-Glasgow-Stirling Trunk Road (North of Cumbernauld to Hags Diversion) Order 1961, which provided *inter alia* for the construction of an electrically operated Bascule Bridge over the navigable waters of the Forth and Clyde Canal, will be amended in so far as it refers to the construction of this bridge. This opening bridge has not been constructed and a fixed bridge over the Canal will be provided.
