TRUNK ROADS ACT 1946 and 1936 *Amendment to Waukmill Diversion*

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 11 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, and section 13 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1936, all as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, the effect of which will be that the Dennyloanhead-Kincardine-Kirkcaldy-St. Andrews Trunk Road (Waukmill and Other Diversions) Order 1955 will be amended in that a new route will be substituted for the route of the Waukmill Diversion which he proposes to construct at Waukmill in the County of Fife.
