NOTICE Is Hereby Given that proposals for alterations to the above Development Plan (hereinafter referred to as "the proposals") were submitted to the Secretary of State on the seventh day of March 1963. The proposals relate to an area of land extending to 4.5 acres or thereby situated on the south-west side of Groat's Road, Aberdeen, and extending 167 yards or thereby south-eastwards from a point thereon 117 yards or thereby south-eastward of Skene Road, to the municipal caravan site.

TEMPORARY CLOSING OF KENNETH STREET (PART)

The Burgh of Inverness (Kenneth Street) (Prohibition of through Vehicular Traffic) Order No. 1. 1963

SCHEDULE

The Order has the effect of temporarily closing to through vehicular traffic that length and part of Kenneth Street from a point opposite number 30 Kenneth Street (approximately 65 yards north west of the Tomnahurich Street junction) and

extending north west along Kenneth Street for a distance of approximately 230 yards to a point opposite number 54 Kenneth Street (approximately 30 yards north west of the junction with Fairfield Road and Greig Street), to permit of road reconstruction in Kenneth Street.

The Alternative Route for through traffic From The North will be via Wells Street and Huntly Street.

The Alternative Route for through traffic To The North will be via Tomnahurich Street, Planefield Road, Fairfield Road and Percival Road.

No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the undernoted lengths of road otherwise than in the direction specified opposite thereto:

The section of the Kyleakin-Portree-Dunvegan Road (Route A.850) forming the northerly access to Kyleakin Jetty from its junction with the private road to "The Anchorage" to the operational limit of the jetty, a distance of 65 lineal yards or thereby.

West to East

The section of the Kyleakin-Portree-Dunvegan Road (Route A.850) lying to the west of the traffic island site at the junction of the road with the Portree-Staffin Road (Route A.855) at Portree, a distance of 39 lineal or thereby.

South to North
