A NOTE for the Official Liquidator having been presented to the Sheriff of Roxburgh, Berwick & Selkirk at Duns Craving the Court (1) to remit the Business Accounts incurred by the Petitioner as Liquidator to his Solicitors to the Auditor of Court for taxation and to authorise the Petitioner to pay the taxed amount thereof; (2) to remit the Account of Intromissions of the Petitioner as Liquidator for examination and audit to Mr A. M. Anderson, C.A., a partner in the Firm of Messrs. Wylie & Hutton, C.A., 17 Duke Street, Edinburgh, or such other person as to the Court shall seem proper, and to direct such person to report what in his opinion is a suitable remuneration for the Liquidator; (3) on the result of such examination and audit being reported to the Court to fix and declare the amount of the remuneration to be paid to the Petitioner as Liquidator and to authorise him to take credit in his Accounts therefor; (4) to approve of the Petitioner's whole intromissions in said Liquidation and to approve of the Accounts of his intromissions; (5) to authorise the Petitioner to make payment of any balance remaining in his hands to the ranked creditors in proportion to their claims as ranked, and in accordance with a Scheme of Division to be prepared by the Petitioner as Liquidator and lodged in process, and on his doing so, to exoner, acquit and discharge the Liquidator of his whole actings, intromissions and management as Liquidator fore-said, and to grant warrant for delivery of his Bond of Caution; and (6) to make an order (a) dissolving the said Company from the date of the said Order and ordaining the Liquidator to forward a copy of the said Order to the Registrar of Companies in terms of the Statute, and (b) authorising the Liquidator to destroy the books and documents of the Company after the lapse of six months from the date of said Order, or to do further or otherwise in the premises as to the Court may seem proper.

The Sheriff Substitute has pronounced the following Interlocutor—

"Duns, 4th March 1963. The Sheriff Substitute, having considered the foregoing Note, Appoints a copy thereof and of this Deliverance to be posted on the Walls of the Sheriff Court, Duns, and a like copy to be served on the within designed, The Scottish Union & National Insurance Company. Further Appoints Notice of the import of this Note and Deliverance to be advertised once in each of the *Edinburgh Gazette* and *The Berwickshire News* newspaper, and Ordains the said Scottish Union & National Insurance Company and any other persons interested, if they intend to show cause why the prayer of the Petition should not be granted, to lodge answers thereto in the hands of the Sheriff Clerk at Duns within eight days after such intimation, service or advertisement under certification."
