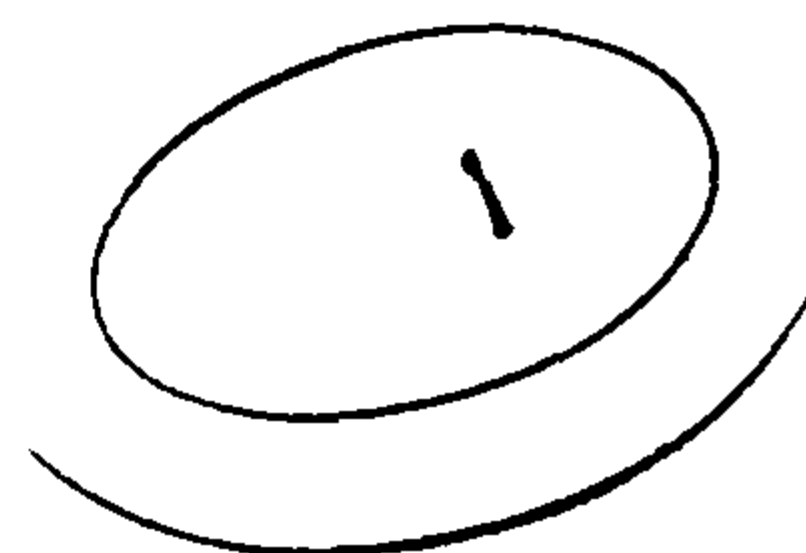

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 29th March 1963, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £220,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st April 1963, to Saturday, the 6th April 1963, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9 The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief, etc.) Order 1962 (Order H.L.(60)) and (2) the revocation of Order H.L.(60).

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 14 days from 26th March 1963. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.

ALKALI &c. WORKS REGULATION (SCOTLAND) ACTS, 1906 and 1951 and ALKALI WORKS (SCOTLAND) ORDERS, 1952 to 1958

THE Secretary of State for Scotland in exercise of the powers contained in section 10 of the Alkali, &c., Works Regulation Act, 1906, has appointed

Horace Leonard Nicholson and
Alexander Baxter Morris Ward

to be Inspectors (Survey Officers) for the period to 31st March 1964, for the purpose of the execution of certain powers under section 12 of the said Act, namely:

- (a) entering any work to which, in the opinion of the Secretary of State for Scotland, the provisions of the said Act applies; and
- (b) ascertaining the quantity of gas, dust and grit discharged into the atmosphere, condensed or otherwise dealt with by applying any such tests as seem to them to be necessary or proper for that purpose.
