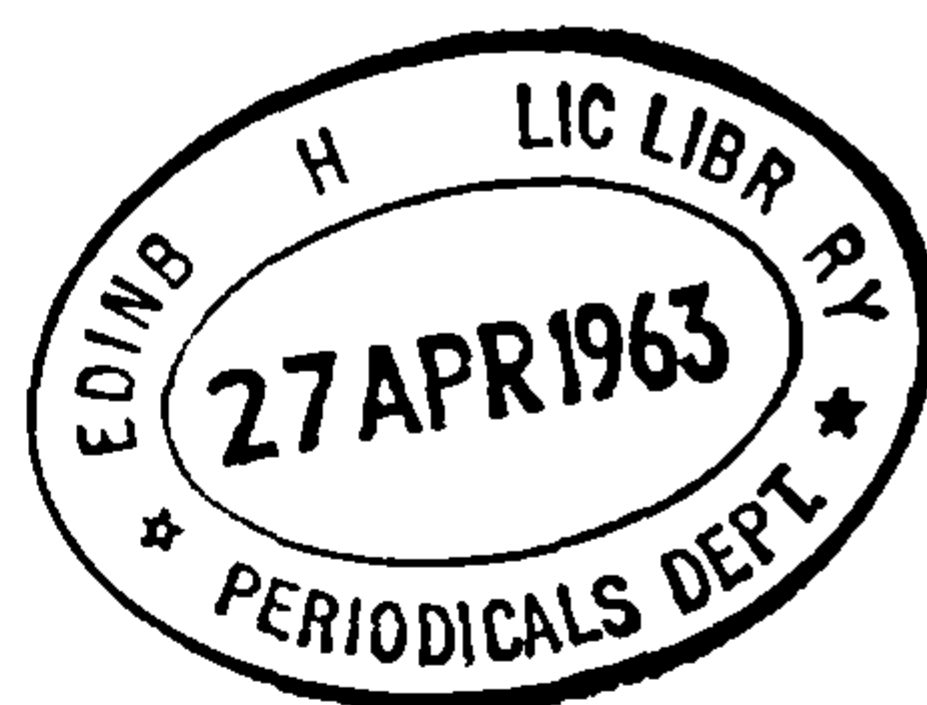

Treasury Chambers S.W.1.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Sections 1 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (General) (No 3) Order, 1963.

This Order amends paragraph (b) of the proviso to Article 2(1) of the Import Duties (General) (No. 3) Order 1961 by omitting words which, if not removed, would nullify the effect of a forthcoming amendment to the European Free Trade Association (Origin of Goods) Regulations, 1960.

That amendment will provide that goods consigned from the Convention area to an exhibition held outside that area and then consigned from the exhibition to the United Kingdom will be treated in the same way as goods consigned from the area to the United Kingdom providing that certain conditions laid down by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise are fulfilled.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st May 1963, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1963, No. 835.

Extension of Burgh Boundaries

THE Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the Burgh of Portknockie have presented to the Sheriff of Aberdeen, Kincardine and Banff, at Banff, an Initial Writ craving the Court:
