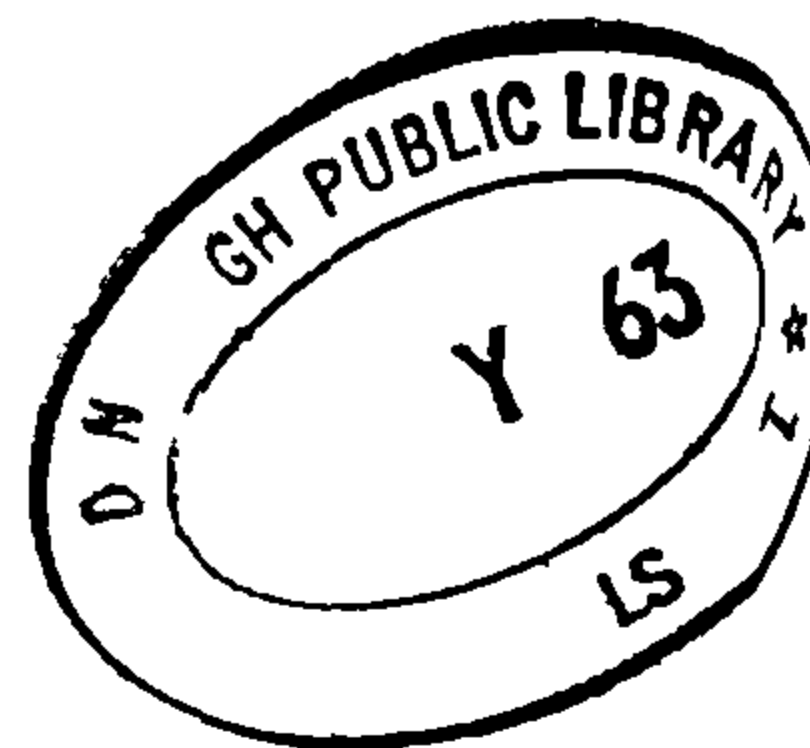

WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1959

LICENSED RESIDENTIAL ESTABLISHMENT AND LICENSED RESTAURANT WAGES COUNCIL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY

Notice by the Commission of Inquiry appointed by the Minister of Labour to inquire into and report on the question whether the field of operation of the Licensed Residential Establishment and Licensed Restaurant Wages Council should be varied.

THE Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") is considering whether he should exercise his powers under Section 4 of the Wages Councils Act, 1959 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") to make an Order varying the field of operation of the Licensed Residential Establishment and Licensed Restaurant Wages Council by the exclusion from the field of operation of that Council of workers employed in the hotel and catering services of the nationalised railways.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Sections 6 and 9 of, and the Fourth Schedule to, the Wages Councils Act, 1959, the Minister has appointed a Commission of Inquiry and has referred to it the question whether the field of operation of the Licensed Residential Establishment and Licensed Restaurant Wages Council should be varied.

On a reference under Section 6 of the Act as to the variation of the field of operation of a wages council, a Commission may make a report to the Minister in accordance with Section 6(3) of the Act.

Accordingly the Commission hereby gives notice, pursuant to Section 9 of the Act, that it will consider representations with respect to the foregoing question which it is its duty to consider made to it in writing at the offices of the Commission at Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London S.W.1 within 40 days from the 3rd May 1963, that is to say, before the 13th day of June 1963.
