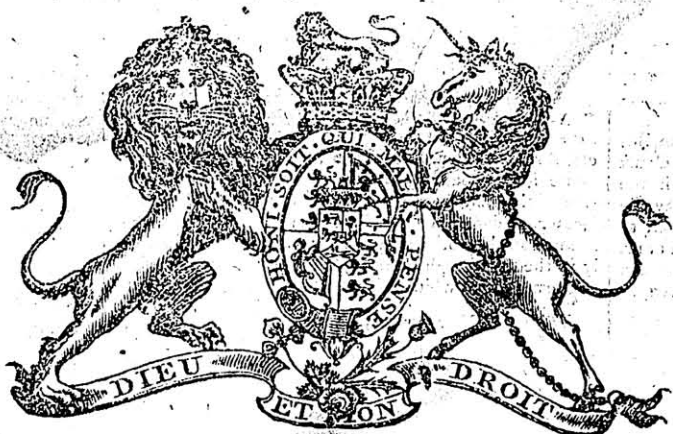

MEMORANDUM.
