MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT 1926 MARKING OF IMPORTED RAW CUCUMBERS

A DRAFT Order in Council to implement the recommendations of the Standing Committee set up by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, on the marking of Imported Raw Cucumbers, has been laid before Parliament.

This Order requires imported raw cucumbers to bear an indication of origin at the time of importation and sale and exposure for sale in the United Kingdom.
