TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th July 1963, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £220,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th July 1963, to Saturday, the 13th July 1963, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926

Marking of imported metal tapes and bands

IN accordance with the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade hereby announce that in pursuance of an application received by them to vary the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 5 Order, 1929, Part IV, as amended, by permitting certain additional methods of marking for metal tapes and bands (printing or durable stamping), they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by the Board of Trade under the Act.

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT

The British Transport Commission (Continuation No. 3) Order 1963

THE Minister of Transport has made an Order (S.I. 1963 No. 1126) under Section 80 of the Transport Act 1962, providing for the further continuance of the British Transport Commission until 1st October 1963, so that the transfer to the new Boards and the Transport Holding Company of property and rights owned by the Commission outside Great Britain may be completed. This Order extends by three months the period of continuance given by S.I. 1963 No. 605.
