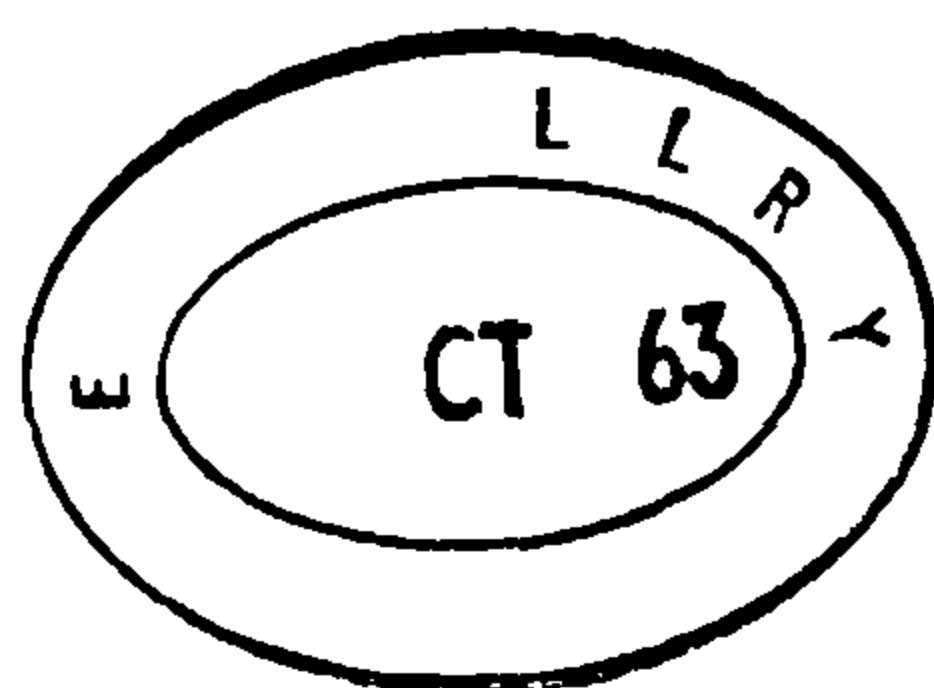

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th October 1963, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £240,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 14th October 1963, to Saturday, the 19th October 1963, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m.

(Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

THE ROYAL BURGH OF DUMFRIES (ST. MARY'S STREET) (UNILATERAL WAITING) ORDER, 1963

SCHEDULE

1. The Order prohibits the waiting of vehicles throughout the 24 hours in St. Mary's Street from its junction with English Street to its junction with Lovers Walk on the east side on those days of the month which bear even numbers and on the west side on those days of the month which bear odd numbers.
2. On the side of the road on which vehicles are not prohibited from waiting by the foregoing paragraph, waiting will be permitted for a period not longer than 20 minutes in any hour.
3. The Order contains special clauses allowing facilities for the loading or unloading of goods, the taking up or setting down of passengers and certain other facilities.

THE GALASHIELS (REGULATION OF TRAFFIC) (MARKET STREET) ORDER, 1963
