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DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1953
Suspension of Withdrawal of Authorities
Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly

WHEREAS the authorities, respectively conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1937, and the Raw Opium, etc., Regulations 1937, on Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly, M.B., Ch.B., by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which those Regulations applied were, the said Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly having been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts 1920 to 1932 withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 7 of the first mentioned Regulations and Regulation 5 of the last mentioned Regulations by Notice published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on 4th January 1952, the registered address of the said Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly being then 185 Westburn Road, Aberdeen:

And Whereas at the same time the Secretary of State directed under the said Regulation 7 that it should not be lawful for the said Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1937:

And Whereas the aforesaid Regulations have been revoked by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1953, and by virtue of Regulation 38 of the last mentioned Regulations the aforesaid withdrawal, direction and suspension are deemed to have been done and given under the said Regulations of 1953:

And Whereas I am satisfied that it is expedient to suspend the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly:

Now, Therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulations 29 and 38 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1953, I hereby suspend the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly and I further suspend the operation of the aforesaid direction regarding prescriptions given in respect of the said Terence O'Neil Fraser Kelly.
