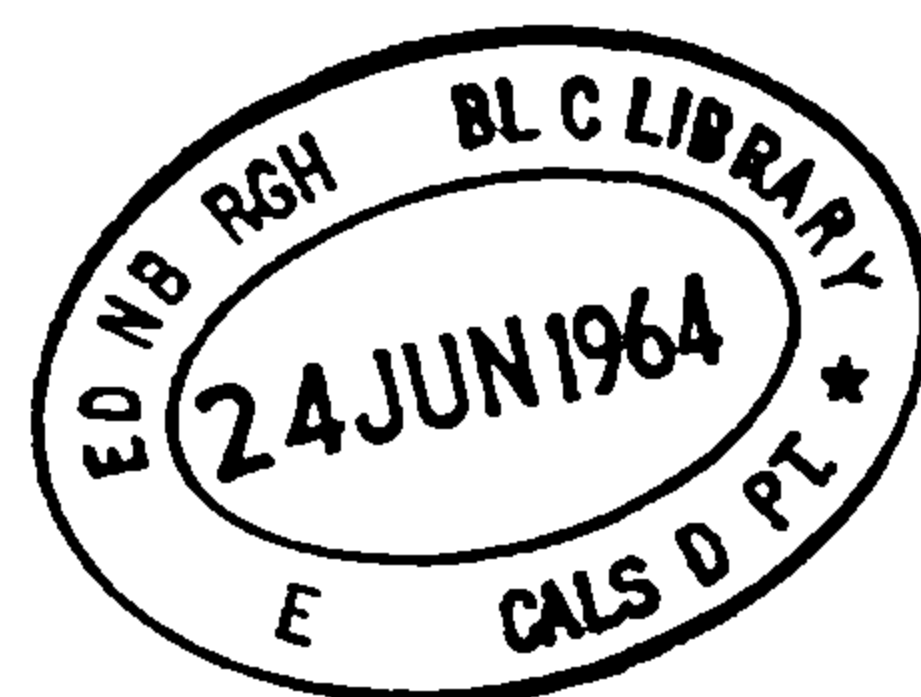

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 26th June 1964 at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £230,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 29th June 1964 to Saturday the 4th July 1964, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

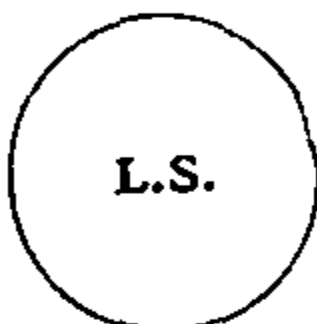

BUILDING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1959

Draft Building Standards (Scotland) Amendment Regulations

NOTICE Is Hereby Given that the Secretary of State proposes to make regulations under section 3 of the above Act prescribing standards in relation to matters specified in the Fourth Schedule to that Act, to amend certain of the Building Standards (Scotland) Regulations 1963 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal regulations").

The regulations proposed to be made are similar to Regulations 3 and 5 of the Draft Building Standards (Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 1964 published by the Secretary of State on 13th March 1964.

The proposed regulations deal respectively with amendments to Regulation 6 of the principal regulations—occupant capacity of buildings—and Regulation 41 thereof—fuel oil storage tanks.

- (c) consult the Building Standards Advisory Committee as to any alteration that he may propose to the drafts.

FLOOD PREVENTION (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1961

DUMFRIES TOWN COUNCIL FLOOD PREVENTION SCHEME, 1964
