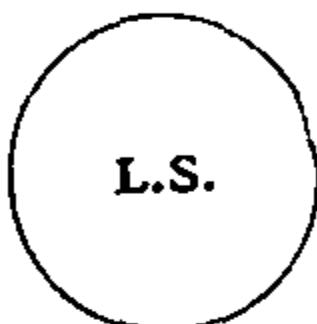

BUILDING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1959

Draft Building Standards (Scotland) Amendment Regulations

NOTICE Is Hereby Given that the Secretary of State proposes to make regulations under section 3 of the above Act prescribing standards in relation to matters specified in the Fourth Schedule to that Act, to amend certain of the Building Standards (Scotland) Regulations 1963 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal regulations").

The regulations proposed to be made are similar to Regulations 3 and 5 of the Draft Building Standards (Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 1964 published by the Secretary of State on 13th March 1964.

The proposed regulations deal respectively with amendments to Regulation 6 of the principal regulations—occupant capacity of buildings—and Regulation 41 thereof—fuel oil storage tanks.

A copy of the draft of the proposed regulations has been deposited at each of the following places:

- a St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh 1.
- (b) Scottish Office, Dover House, Whitehall, London S.W.1.

These copies together with a note of explanation of the regulations are available for inspection by the public free of charge during normal office hours. Copies of the regulations and note may be obtained on application to the Secre-

tary, Scottish Development Department, York Buildings, Queen Street, Edinburgh 2.

Any representation as to the draft regulations must be made in writing to the Secretary of State not later than 10th July 1964. The representation must state the grounds on which it is made and should be addressed to the Secretary, Scottish Development Department, York Buildings, Queen Street, Edinburgh 2.

Before making any regulations under the said section 3, the Secretary of State must—

- (a) if required by any person who has duly lodged representations with him, direct the holding of a public inquiry with respect to such representations;
- (b) consider any representations so lodged and the report of the person holding the inquiry, if any, and
- (c) consult the Building Standards Advisory Committee as to any alteration that he may propose to the drafts.

50 m.p.h. SPEED LIMIT

THE Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he intends to make an Order under Section 11 of the Road Traffic Act 1962, the effect of which will be that, during the following periods, the lengths of trunk road specified in the Schedule to this notice shall become subject to a speed limit of 50 m.p.h.:

- from noon on Friday, 3rd July 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 5th July 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 10th July 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 12th July 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 17th July 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 19th July 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 24th July 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 26th July 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 31st July 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 2nd August 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 7th August 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 9th August 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 14th August 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 16th August 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 21st August 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 23rd August 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 28th August 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 30th August 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 4th September 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 6th September 1964;
- from noon on Friday, 11th September 1964, to midnight at the end of Sunday, 13th September 1964.
