WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

Notice of intention to make an order varying the field of operation of The Licensed Residential Establishment and Licensed Restaurant Wages Council

THE Minister of Labour having received the report dated 26th May 1964 of the Commission of Inquiry appointed under section 6 of the Wages Councils Act 1959 to consider the question whether the field of operation of the Licensed Residential Establishment and Licensed Restaurant Wages Council should be varied, hereby gives notice that he now intends pursuant to the powers conferred on him by section 4 of the said Act to make an order varying the field of operation of the said Wages Council by excluding therefrom workers employed in the hotel and catering services of the nationalised railways who are so employed by the British Railways Board or by British Transport Hotels Limited.

THE LEAD PROCESSES (MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS) REGULATIONS 1964—S.I. 1964 No. 1728

THE Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that on 28th October 1964 he made the Lead Processes (Medical Examinations) Regulations 1964.

These Regulations provide that medical examinations required by virtue of the instruments specified in the Schedule thereto (which relate to the employment of persons in certain lead processes) shall periodically include an estimation of the haemoglobin content of the blood and empower the appointed factory doctor, where the haemoglobin content is found to be below a specified level, to require a further estimation after such interval as he may determine. The Regulations further provide that the occupier of a factory shall send to the Factory Inspector for the District at specified intervals a copy of every entry made in the health register by the appointed doctor.

The Regulations come into operation on 26th November 1964.

IMPOSITION OF 40 m.p.h. SPEED LIMIT

SCOTTISH HOME AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS, 1937 to 1948 AUSTRALIA

THE Secretary of State gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises the additional Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as showing (a) that the meat to which the Certificate relates or the meat, from which the meat product to which the Certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretaries of State; and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing of the meat or meat product.

The Certificates are in the form of stamps or impressions and the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly shown on the meat or the package containing the meat or meat products. The recognition of the Certificates is restricted to those which are completed by the insertion of one of the establishment numbers shown in the Schedule.

The Certificate previously recognised as an Official Certificate and reproduced in Part 1 of the Schedule to the notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of the 18th October 1938, will continue to be recognised for the importation of edible tallow and animal casings but is revoked with effect from 1st December 1964, for the importation of all meat and all other meat products.

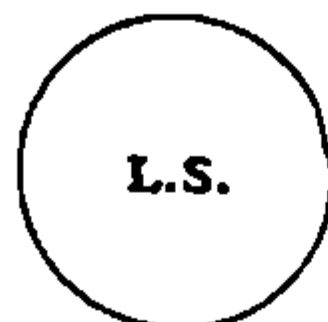
