SPECIAL ROADS ACT 1949

RENFREW BYPASS SPECIAL ROAD

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made the Renfrew Bypass Special Road (Improvements) Order 1965 under sections 3 and 7 of the Special Roads Act 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955, the effect of which, in relation to that section of the Renfrew Bypass Special Road from near Renfrew Road (A.8) in the City of Glasgow to Barnsford Road (A.726) in the County of Renfrew, is:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter roads,
- (b) to stop up roads,
- (c) to construct new roads all on or in the vicinity of the route of the above-mentioned Special Road,
- (d) to provide a new means of access to premises, and
- (e) to provide for the transfer of each of the said new roads to the highway authorities specified therefor in the order as from the 16th May next after the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the appropriate authority concerned that the new road has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Copies of the order and of the plan referred to therein have been deposited at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh 1, from whom copies of the order can be obtained, Renfrew County Council, County Buildings, Paisley; the Corporation of the City of Glasgow, City Chambers, Glasgow; Paisley Town Council, Town Clerk's Office, Paisley, and Renfrew Town Council, Town Clerk's Office, Renfrew, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

Any Person aggrieved by the order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the statutory powers or that any requirement of the said Act of 1949 or of regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the order, may within six weeks of 18th June 1965, apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the order or of any provision contained therein.
