### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. IRON AND STEEL ACT, 1953

*Price Determination by the Iron and Steel Board*

NOTICE Is Hereby Given that the Iron and Steel Board have, pursuant to section 8 of the Iron and Steel Act, 1953, by an instrument in writing which will be known as Iron and Steel Board Price Determination 1965, No. 3, varied the Iron and Steel Board Price Determination 1965, No. 2.
