### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 25th June 1965, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 28th June 1965, to Saturday the 3rd July 1965, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be

made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 pm. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

### WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING WAGES COUNCIL (SCOTLAND)

THE Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Scotland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) varying the provisions relating to statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing) (Scotland) Order 1964 (Order W.D.S.(79)); (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Scotland) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order 1953 (Order W.D.S. (55)); and (3) the revocation of Order W.D.S.(79) and Order W.D.S.(55).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 21 days from 22nd June 1965. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Scotland), Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.
