HUNGARY

THE Secretary of State gives Notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that the Official Certificate reproduced in the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 29th November, 1957, for the importation of meat and meat products from the Hungarian Peoples Republic is modified with effect from 1st August 1965, to the extent that recognition is restricted to those Certificates which are completed by the insertion of one of the appropriate establishment numbers listed in the Schedule hereto.

The words "No. of establishment" followed by the appropriate establishment number shall be inserted on the Official Certificate between the wording "Place and date" and "by the Hungarian Minister of."

SCHEDULE

REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA
