The Abstract of Factories Act Order 1965

(S.I. 1965 No. 1903).

THE Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that on 2nd November he made the Abstract of Factories Act Order 1965. This Order which comes into operation on 15th November 1965 prescribes the abstract of the Factories Act 1961 required by section 138 (1) of that Act to be kept posted at the principal entrances of a factory at which employed persons enter, and revokes the Abstract of Factories Act Order 1962 (S.I. 1962 No. 2626). The abstract has been amended at Section 30 to take into account the provisions of the Examination of Steam Boilers Regulations 1964 (S.I. 1964 No. 781) and at Section 32 in consequence of the issue of the Factories Act 1961 (Extension of Section 40) Regulations 1964 (S.I. 1964 No. 762).

The abstract is not for use in the cases of docks, wharves, quays and certain warehouses lines and sidings or in the cases of building operations and work of engineering construction.
