THE CORPORATION OF GLASGOW

(Parking Places) (Watt Street) Order, 1966

ON the 3rd day of February 1966 the Corporation of the City of Glasgow made an Order under section 81 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960 and subsection (2) of section 11 of the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, the effect of which is:

- (1) to discontinue the use as parking places for motor cars of the carriageway in the centre of Watt Street between
 - (a) Scotland Street and Ardgowan Street;
 - (b) Ardgowan Street and Avon Street; and
 - (c) Avon Street and Houston Street;

- (2) to authorise and order the use as parking places for motor cars between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays inclusive of the carriageway of Watt Street

The County of Stirling Development Plan Amendment
(New Road: Lathallan-Bowhouse) Order, 1966

NOTICE Is Hereby Given that on the Twenty-fifth day of January Nineteen Hundred and Sixty-six, the Secretary of State for Scotland approved, without modification, the alteration of the County Development Plan to indicate the first section of the route of a proposed new road connecting the M.9 with the new town of Livingston, being the section from Lathallan to Bowhouse Railway Bridge.

A certified copy of the extract of the Development Plan as altered by the Secretary of State has been deposited at the office of the County Planning Department, 18 Melville Terrace, Stirling, at the County Offices, Viewforth, Stirling and at the County Council Offices, West Bridge Street, Falkirk.

Each extract of the altered Development Plan so deposited is available for inspection by the public, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive each week for a period of six weeks from the date of publication of this notice.

The alteration to the Development Plan becomes operative as from Fourth February Nineteen Hundred and Sixty-six, but if any person aggrieved by the alteration desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the alteration, he may, within six weeks from the Fourth day of February Nineteen Hundred and Sixty-six, make application to the Court of Session.
