SCHEDULE

No person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and midnight on the following lengths of Route A.941 in New Elgin in the Parish of Elgin and County of Moray—

- (a) That length of Route A.941 in New Elgin from the south side of its junction with Cemetery Road southwards to a point twenty-five yards south of its junction with Smith Street a distance of 213 yards or thereby;
- (b) That length of Route A.941 in New Elgin from a point 50 yards south of its junction with Land Street in a southerly direction to its junction with Thornhill Road (unclassified) a distance of 190 yards or thereby;

but nothing in the said Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in said lengths of road for so long as may be necessary—(a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; or (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other street, to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any part of said lengths of roads or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any part of the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878.
