A PROCLAMATION

FOR APPOINTING TUESDAY, DECEMBER 27th, 1966, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES AND IN NORTHERN IRELAND

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas We consider it desirable that Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, should be observed as a holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland:

We do hereby appoint the said twenty-seventh day of December to be observed as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland and by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly:

And We do further hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Bank Holidays Act 1871, and section 3(3) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952, appoint the said twenty-seventh day of December to be observed in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland as a Bank Holiday, and as a holiday in the customs and excise, under and in accordance with the said Acts.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this eleventh day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, and in the fifteenth year of Our Reign.
