TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 21st October 1966, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £150,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 24th October to Saturday the 29th October 1966, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Notice under section 29

THE Secret ry of State hereby gives notic that he is considering the making of an Order under section 29 of the Prices and Inc mes Act 1966, in the terms s t out at the end of this notice, applying that section to remuneration und r contracts of employment for work of the de cription specified in the Order.

If the Order is made an employer shall not, while the Order is in force, pay remuneration of that description at a rate which exceeds the rate of remuneration paid by him for the same kind of work within the period specified in Article 3 of the Order by any amount unless the Minister of Labour has given his consent in writing to an exces of that amount, or of a greater amount.

Anv employer, or any employers' organisation, trade union, trade union organisation or other person representing employers or employees may make repre entations as respects the proposed Order in writing to the Secretary of State addressed to the Department of Economic Affair, Storev's Gate, London S.W.1, within 14 days from 14th October 1966.

After the expiration of that period, and subject to consideration of any repre entations duly made, the propo ed Order may be made in the following terms—
