NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT, 1952

PURSUANT to section 175(5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely: a Minox camera and accessories and a Speedgraphic camera and accessories found in a trunk at Deans Court, St. Andrew's University on the 24th September 1964 have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said goods being goods chargeable with a duty of Customs were without payment of that duty unshipped in a port or unloaded from an aircraft in the United Kingdom.

Whereby and by force of section 44 of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS 1877 to 1927

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Scotland have made the following Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts 1877 to 1927:

The Importation of Plants and Plant Produce (Health) (Great Britain) (Amendment) Order 1966
(S.I. 1966 No. 1308)

This Order amends the Importation of Plants and Plant Produce (Health) (Great Britain) Order 1965 by adding Malta to the areas from which the importation of carnation, chrysanthemum and pelargonium plants is prohibited (except under licence).

The Order comes into operation on 26th October 1966.
