Public Health (Imported Food) (Scotland) Regulations 1937 to 1948

## UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

THE Secretary of State gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he hereby recognises the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat to which it relates or the meat from which the meat products to which it relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post-mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State, and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to the Public Health were taken in the dressing or preparing of the meat or meat products.


The Certificate, being in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the package containing the meat or meat products, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The label hereby recognised is in addition to the Official Certificate as published in the Edinburgh Gazette of 5th June 1964 and 21st October 1966 for the importation of meat and meat products from the United States of America, and will continue to be recognised until 31st March 1967 when it will be revoked.


