*Draft Findhorn Bay (Prevention of Pollution) (Tidal
Waters) Order 1967*

NOTICE is hereby given in terms of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule to the Rivers (Prevention of Pollution) (Scotland) Act 1951 that the Secretary of State, on the application of the Banff, Moray and Nairn River Purification Board and after consultation with the Board and the Council of every county or large burgh whose district is comprised wholly or partly in the area affected, has prepared a draft Order in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 29 of that Act as read with section 8 of the Rivers (Prevention of Pollution) (Scotland) Act 1965.

The purpose of the order is to apply the provisions of the 1951 and 1965 Acts, in so far as they are not already applied, to the tidal waters of Findhorn Bay and of all streams flowing into that Bay, all within an imaginary line drawn across the entrance to the Bay from a point in the Parish of Kinloss approximately north-west of Findhorn (identified by the map co-ordinates NJ 03206470) due south to a point in the Parish of Dyke, and Moy approximately west of Findhorn (identified by the map co-ordinates NJ 03206450). The provisions of the 1951 Act will be applied from 1st May 1967, and those of sections 1-3 of the 1965 Act from 1st May 1968.

A copy of the draft Order and relevant map and a written statement in support of the application of the said River Purification Board may be inspected by any person free of charge at the office of the Board, County Buildings, Elgin, during office hours from 6th January to 10th February 1967.

Objections to the draft Order may be submitted in writing before 13th February 1967, to the Secretary, Scottish Development Department, St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh 1, from whom copies of the draft Order may be obtained by any person interested at the price of 2s. each.

The copy of the amended development plan so deposited is available for inspection by the public, free of charge, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive. The amendment of the development plan became operative as from the 6th day of January 1967 but if any person aggrieved by the amendment desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the amendment, he may, within six weeks from the 6th day of January 1967 make an application to the Court of Session.
