8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 20th January 1967, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £130,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 23rd January to Saturday the 28th January 1967, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent.

THE REMUNERATION OF MILK DISTRIBUTORS

IN July 1965, the Central Milk Distributive Committee for England and Wales in association with the Scottish Milk Consultative Committee and the Federation of Northern Ireland Dairymen applied to the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and to the Secretary of State for Scotland for a substantial but undefined increase as from 1st October 1965 in the remuneration of all sections of the milk distributive industry. Up to 30th September 1966, the system of remuneration was based upon fixed guaranteed target rates of profit, which were subject to review. A decision on the application for an increase was deferred during the prices and incomes standstill. The Government now consider it desirable that, consistently with the guarantee arrangements for milk producers and Government control of distributive margins and retail milk prices, the National Board for Prices and Incomes should examine the methods and level of remuneration of distributors (other than producer-retailers) of liquid milk in the United Kingdom from the point of first sale by or through the agency
