TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 3rd March 1967, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £120,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 6th March to Saturday the 11th March 1967, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

(being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

GREENLOANING DIVERSION SIDE ROADS

The effect of the proposed Order is as follows, viz.:

1. To prohibit (subject to certain exceptions) the waiting of vehicles during the whole 24 hours of every week-day in any of the following lengths of road:

(1) Brook Street, Broughty Ferry—

(a) On north side thereof:

- (i) For a distance of 45 feet eastwards from the intersection of the north kerbline of Brook Street with the east kerbline of Fort Street; and
- (ii) For a distance of 45 feet westwards from the intersection of the north kerbline of Brook Street with the west kerbline of Gray Street; and
- (iii) For a distance of 45 feet eastwards from the intersection of the north kerbline of Brook Street with the east kerbline of Gray Street; and
- (iv) For a distance of 45 feet westwards from the intersection of the north kerbline of Brook Street with the west kerbline of St. Vincent Street.

(b) On the south side thereof:

- (i) For a distance of 45 feet eastwards from the intersection of the south kerbline of Brook Street with the east kerbline of Fort Street; and
- (ii) For a distance of 45 feet westwards from the intersection of the south kerbline of Brook Street with the west kerbline of Gray Street; and
- (iii) For a distance of 45 feet eastwards from the intersection of the south kerbline of Brook Street with the east kerbline of Gray Street; and
- (iv) For a distance of 45 feet westwards from the intersection of the south kerbline of Brook Street with the west kerbline of St. Vincent Street.

(2) Fort Street, Broughty Ferry—

- (a) For a distance of 45 feet northwards from the intersection of the east kerbline of Fort Street with the north kerbline of Brook Street; and

- (b) For a distance of 45 feet southwards from the intersection of the east kerbline of Fort Street with the south kerbline of Brook Street.
- (3) Gray Street, Broughty Ferry—
- (a) On the west side thereof:
- For a distance of 45 feet southwards from the intersection of the west kerbline of Gray Street with the south kerbline of Queen Street; and
 - For a distance of 45 feet northwards from the intersection of the west kerbline of Gray Street with the north kerbline of Brook Street; and
 - For a distance of 45 feet southwards from the intersection of the west kerbline of Gray Street with the south kerbline of Brook Street; and
 - For a distance of 45 feet northwards from the intersection of the west kerbline of Gray Street with the north kerbline of Long Lane; and
 - For a distance of 45 feet southwards from the intersection of the west kerbline of Gray Street with the south kerbline of Long Lane; and
 - For a distance of 45 feet northwards from the intersection of the west kerbline of Gray Street with the north kerbline of King Street.
- (b) On the east side thereof:
- For a distance of 45 feet southwards from the intersection of the east kerbline of Gray Street with the south kerbline of Queen Street; and
 - For a distance of 45 feet northwards from the intersection of the east kerbline of Gray Street with the north kerbline of Brook Street; and
 - For a distance of 45 feet southwards from the intersection of the east kerbline of Gray Street with the south kerbline of Brook Street; and
