TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 29th September 1967, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £210,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 2nd October to Saturday the 7th October 1967, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC

THE Secretary of State gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that his recognition of the Official Certificates reproduced in 1 and 2 of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 29th March 1938, design 2 in the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 18th March 1952, and designs 1, 2 and 3 in the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 24th July 1964, for the importation of meat and meat products from the Argentine Republic, is hereby modified to the extent shown in the Schedule hereto.

The Notices published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and dated 5th August 1966, 9th September 1966, 30th December 1966 and 20th January 1967 are hereby revoked.

In relation to canned meat, the recognition is restricted to Certificates of the design reproduced in 2 of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 18th March 1952, and the design 1 in the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 24th July 1964, which are completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers:
