

## WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACT 1949

THE Postmaster General hereby gives notice to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (Including Television)— General Form" (under paragraph 7 of the Schedule thereto), to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (Including Television)—Multiple form" (under paragraph 7 of the First Schedule thereto) and to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (including Television)—Hotels Comprehensive form" (under paragraph 7 of the First Schedule thereto) that on and from the 8th February 1968 the terms of the said Licences are hereby varied as follows:

(1) Clause 1(b) thereof shall be varied so as to read as follows:

"to use the said apparatus for the purposes of receiving

- (i) visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the said apparatus in monochrome only and messages sent by telephony from authorised Broadcasting Stations for general reception, and
- (ii) visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the said apparatus in monochrome only and messages sent by telephony or telegraphy from licensed amateur stations."
