WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

HOLLOW-WARE WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Hollow-ware Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Hollow-ware) Order 1967 (Order H.(94)) and (2) the revocation of Order H.(94).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 14 days from 9th February 1968. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.

Public Health (Imported Food) (Scotland) Regulations 1937 to 1948

URUGUAY

THE Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that his recognition of the Official Certificates reproduced in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 29th March 1938, for the importation of meat and meat products from Uruguay, is hereby modified to the extent shown in the Schedule hereto.

The Notices published in the *Edinburgh Gazettes* dated 24th December 1965, 26th August 1966 and 28th April 1967 are hereby revoked.

In relation to meat, recognition is restricted to these Certificates which are completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers:

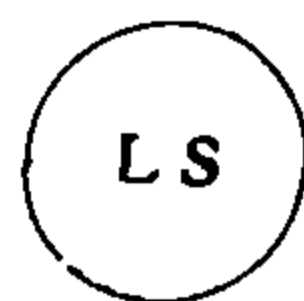

TRUNK ROADS ACT 1946

GREENOCK BURGH BOUNDARY TO INVERKIP TRUNKING AND DETRUNKING ORDER

THE Secretary of State proposes to make an order under which part of the existing Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton trunk road from Greenock burgh boundary, west through Gourrock to Cloch Point and then south to its junction with the Greenock-Inverkip road for a distance of 5.87 miles, will cease to be a trunk road from 16th May 1968 and will become a principal (classified) road. From the same date that part of the existing Greenock-Inverkip road extending south westwards from the I.B.M. factory at Greenock burgh boundary to its junction with the trunk road will become part of the trunk road.

Copies of the draft order and the plan referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 13th February 1968 to 13th May 1968 at the office of the Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh 1, and at the office of the Town Clerk of Gourrock.

Any Person may within three months from 13th February 1968 object to the making of the order by notice in writing
