

BANKING HOURS

The Scottish Banks intimate that as from Monday, 10th. June, 1968 [inclusive] the hours of opening for business at their Head Offices and Branches in Scotland will be as follows, viz.:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday 9.30am — 12.30pm
1.30pm — 3.30pm
Thursday 9.30am — 12.30pm
1.30pm — 3.30pm
4.30pm — 6.00pm
Friday 9.30am — 3.30pm

The Banks will be closed on Saturdays.

Full banking services will be available at all the above sessions, but transactions during the evening session will be carried forward to the book-keeping of the next business day.

A measure of flexibility may be introduced to meet local requirements; in certain localities, for instance, lunch-time opening on Friday may be superfluous, but apart from that particular aspect it is not envisaged that modifications will lead to a reduction in the total of weekly business hours.

Bills of Exchange which are domiciled at Branches of the Banks in Scotland and which fall to be paid on a Saturday will be treated as being payable on the first business day thereafter.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Import Duties Act 1958, and Section 2(5) of the Finance Act 1965.

Viz.: The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 3) Order 1968.

This Order:

- (i) revokes the existing fixed rate of drawback of import duty for canned or bottled foodstuffs and provides for drawback to be related to the duty paid on the imported tomato puree actually used in the manufacture of the exported goods;
- (ii) revokes the provision for the allowance of drawback of import duty on printed drip mats manufactured from imported wood pulp board; and
- (iii) extends the scope of the existing provisions for the drawback of import duty in respect of blends of quebracho extract manufactured from imported quebracho extract.

This Order comes into operation on 4th April 1968, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1968 No. 481.
