### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 14th June 1968, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £150,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 17th June 1968, to Saturday the 22nd June 1968, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

**THE OFFICES, SHOPS AND RAILWAY PREMISES  
(HOISTS AND LIFTS) REGULATIONS 1968**

THE First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that on 27th May 1968 she made the Offices, Shops and Railway Premises (Hoists and Lifts) Regulations 1968 which come into operation on 28th May 1969. These Regulations impose requirements as to the construction, maintenance and examination of hoists and lifts in offices, shops and railway premises. They also require liftways to be enclosed and the provision of gates fitted with devices for securing that the gates cannot be opened unless a lift is at the landing and that a lift cannot be moved away from the landing until the gates are closed. They also require that every lift shall be marked with its maximum safe working load. The Regulations exempt from certain requirements certain lifts and hoists subject to specified conditions and limitations.

ROAD**

To revise, alter and extend the boundaries of the Burgh of Kelso for the purposes of the Burgh Police (Scotland) Act, 1892 and Acts amending the same and the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1947 so as to include the two areas of ground in the First and Second Places hereinafter particularly described and at present lying within the Landward area of the County of Roxburgh *videlicet*.—*In the First Place* that area of ground marked area Number 1 on the plan hereinafter mentioned extending to forty-six acres bounded on the north by the railway line, on the west by Yetholm Road B.6352, on the east by Wooden Burn and on the south by the boundary of the Pinnacle Hill Farm which area of ground is bounded as follows *videlicet*.—Commencing at the point where the south-eastern boundary of the Burgh joins the north-eastern side of Station Road, B.6352, thence in a

south-easterly direction along the said side of road to its junction with the south-eastern boundary of parcel number 2600, as shown on Ordnance Survey 1/2,500 scale plan NT 7232 and 7332, Revision of 1964; thence in a north-easterly direction along the south-eastern boundary of the said parcel on the said plan and also on Ordnance Survey 1/2,500 scale plan NT 7233 and 7333, Revision of 1964; continuing in the same direction along the south-eastern boundary of parcel number 5029 on the said plan; continuing along the north-western boundary of parcel 6623 and in prolongation thereof to the centre of Wooden Burn; thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said burn to the Burgh Boundary; thence in a south-westerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement, and *In the Second Place* that area of ground marked area Number 2 on the said plan extending to Eighteen acres lying to the north of the Border Ice Rink and Broompark and to the west of Ednam Road which area of ground marked area Number 2 is defined as follows *videlicet*.—Commencing at the point on Ordnance Survey 1/2,500 scale plan NT 7235 and 7335 Revision of 1964, where the northern boundary of the Burgh joins the north-western side of the road (A.699) from Kelso to Ednam; thence in a northerly direction along the side of the said road to the junction with the north-eastern boundary of parcel number 0900, as shown on the said plan; thence in a north-westerly direction along the north-eastern boundary of the said parcel; continuing in the same direction along the north-eastern boundary of parcel number 0006, and of parcel number 9719 on the said plan to its northernmost corner; thence in a westerly direction in a straight line to its junction with the Burgh boundary on the south-eastern boundary of parcel number 5139 on the said plan; thence in a south-easterly and then in a north-easterly direction along the said northern boundary of the Burgh to the point of commencement; all as the said two areas of ground are delineated and hatched in red and marked respectively Area Number 1 and Area Number 2 on said plan which is docquetted and signed as relative hereto or such other boundaries as may appear to the Court just and proper to mark out, define and specify in a written Deliverance to be pronounced hereon such revised, altered and extended boundaries and to grant Warrant to record this Application and Deliverance thereon in the Books of the Court.

2. To determine that such alteration of the Burgh Boundary shall come into force and take effect on and from 16th May 1968.
