TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 31st January 1969, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 3rd February 1969 to Saturday the 8th February 1969, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
6. Notification will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the

amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TRUNK ROADS ACT 1946

Provision of Dual Carriageway Trunk Road from  
West Ferry to Port Glasgow

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an order to provide for:

- (a) the construction of three diversions of the Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton trunk road, A.8, at West Ferry, Langbank and west of Langbank in the County of Renfrew and
- (b) the length of the existing trunk road through the village of Langbank superseded by one of the diversions ceasing to be part of the trunk road.

Copies of the draft order and relevant plan and a statement explaining the proposals may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 30th January 1969, to 30th April 1969, at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh 1, at Renfrew County Council, County Buildings, Paisley and at the District Council Office, Main Road, Bishopton.

Any Person may within three months from 30th January 1969, object to the making of the order by notice in writing to the Secretary, Scottish Development Department, 43 Jeffrey Street, Edinburgh 1, quoting reference R/TO/1/RN/34 and stating the grounds of objection.

Owners and tenants of property likely to be affected by the proposals may obtain an explanatory leaflet on application to the Department, District Valuer, or local authority.
