The Imported Food (Scotland) Regulations 1968

### SWITZERLAND: OFFICIAL CERTIFICATE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food (Scotland) Regulations 1968, he hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificate, of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto, as showing:

- (a) that the meat to which it relates, or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Official Certificate is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) This recognition applies only to meat and meat products imported from Switzerland but does not apply to any such meat or meat products derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where the Certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Official Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product.

Part XIX of the Schedule to the Notice published in the Edinburgh Gazette dated 14th September 1937 is hereby revoked.

#### Schedule

For meat and meat products (including canned meat) a label or stamp in the form set out below.



The Certificate will be completed by the insertion of the establishment number.

SWEDEN: OFFICIAL CERTIFICATE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food (Scotland) Regulations 1968, he hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto, as showing:

- (a) that the meat to which it relates, or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State; and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Official Certificate is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) This recognition applies only to meat and meat products imported from Sweden but does not apply to any such meat or meat products derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where the Certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product.
- (iii) Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent indicated in the Second Schedule hereto.

Part X of the Schedule to the Notice published in the Edinburgh Gazette dated 29th March 1938, and the Notice published in the Edinburgh Gazette dated 12th May 1967, are hereby revoked.
