A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING A NEW DESIGN FOR CUPRO-NICKEL CROWN PIECES AND MAKING THE SAID CROWN PIECES CURRENT AND LEGAL TENDER IN THE TURKS AND CAICOS ISLANDS.

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas by virtue of Proclamations issued under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1946 certain provisions of those Acts are in force in the Turks and Caicos Islands:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine as hereinafter specified a new design for the cupro-nickel Crown, being one of the cupro-nickel coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act 1946, to be struck at Our Mint in London, and to order that the said Crowns shall be current and legal tender in the Turks and Caicos Islands:

We, therefore, in pursuance of section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870 and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

1. There shall be coined at Our Mint in London cupro-nickel Crowns of the following design:

For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH II D. G. REGINA" and for the reverse the Turks and Caicos Islands Coat of Arms granted by Royal Warrant on the twenty-eighth day of September One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five with the inscription "TURKS AND CAICOS ISLANDS ONE CROWN" and the date "1969."

2. The said coins shall be current and legal tender within the Turks and Caicos Islands.

3. This Proclamation shall be published in the official gazette of the Turks and Caicos Islands and shall come into force on the date on which it is so published.

and direct that, after those respective dates, those coins shall not be current or legal tender within Gibraltar.

THE LICENSING (SCOTLAND) ORDER 1969

THE Secretary of State hereby gives notice that on 23rd July 1969 he made the above Order under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 1959, as amended by the Licensing (Scotland) Act 1969, declaring the populations according to an estimate made by the Registrar-General for Births, Deaths and Marriages for Scotland as at 30th June 1968, of the new burghs of Bishopbriggs and Cumbernauld and of the No. 4 (Glasgow) District of the County of Lanark and of the County of Dumbarton and prescribing 1st September 1969 as the date on which licensing courts for these burghs and a licensing appeal court for Cumbernauld shall be established and alterations in the licensing court of appeal from the burgh licensing courts of Bishopbriggs and Lanark shall take effect. Sea Fish Industry Act, 1951

NOTICE OF GENERAL LEVY REGULATIONS

1. THE White Fish Authority hereby give notice that in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above Acts it is their intention to make Regulations which subject to their confirmation by Order of the Ministers will come into operation on the 30th November 1969, which Regulations provide for:

- an increase in the General Levy on every stone of white fish purchased at firsthand from 1d. to 1½d.;
- the imposition of differential levies as permitted by Section 4(1) (b) of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1968, on white fish products;
- the extension of levy liability to shellfish and imported canned and bottled white fish.

2. The Authority with the concurrence of the Herring Industry Board propose to request Ministers to direct under Section 4(9) of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1968, that all "flours and meals of fish, crustaceans or molluscs, unfit for human consumption" (fishmeal) should for levy purposes be treated as wholly produced from white fish. The Ministers will further be requested to give directions as to how levy received in respect of fishmeal landed is to be divided as between the Authority and the Herring Industry Board.

3. The draft Regulations can be inspected between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive at the office of the White Fish Authority at Lincoln's Inn Chambers, 2/3 Cursitor Street, London E.C.4; at the office of the Scottish Committee of the White Fish Authority at 5 Forres Street, Edinburgh 3; or at the offices of the Ministry of Agriculture, 2/4 Queen Street, Belfast, Northern Ireland.
