### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, 29th August 1969, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £120,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 2nd September 1969 to Friday, 5th September 1969, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

### PROPOSED TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF THE KIRKCALDY-ST. ANDREWS TRUNK ROAD (A.915)

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an order temporarily closing to through traffic the Kirkcaldy-St. Andrews trunk road (Route A.915) from its junction with the route C.35 at Duncan Cottages to its junction with route B.930, just south of Windygates, a distance of approximately 4,650 yards. The closure which is necessary to enable road improvement works to be carried out will operate from 8th September 1969 to 9th January 1970. Traffic requiring access to premises on the road will be unaffected.
