THE Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food (Scotland) Regulations 1968, he hereby recognises, to the extent shown in the Second Schedule hereto and subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto, as showing:—

- (a) that the meat to which they relate, or from which was prepared the meat product to which they relate, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State, and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Certificates are recognised subject to the following conditions:—

- (i) This recognition applies to meat and meat products imported from Kenya but does not apply to any such meat or meat product derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of labels, the recognition will apply only if the labels are securely affixed to the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or meat product, and if the labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificates.
- (iii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of stamps, the recognition will only apply if the stamps are clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or meat product or the package containing the meat or meat product.

Part II of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 5th April 1938, and Part II of the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* dated 17th January 1939, are hereby revoked.

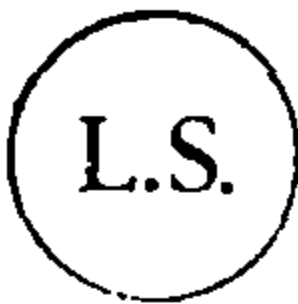
