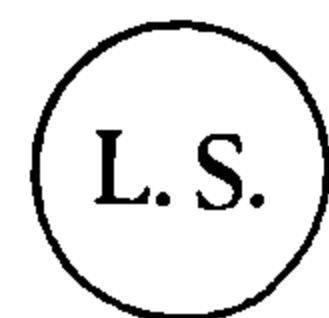

WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTIONS ON  
TRUNK ROAD A.9 IN AUCHTERARDER

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made an order under Sections 1 and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, revoking the Trunk Roads (High Street, Auchterarder) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 1968 and imposing new restrictions on lengths of the trunk road (route A.9) at Auchterarder.

Exceptions permit waiting for the purposes of, picking up and setting down passengers, loading or unloading goods, the maintenance of the road, and the supply of gas, electricity and water.
