The QUEEN has been pleased by Warrant under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 25th June 1970, to direct the issue of a Commission under the Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and made use of in place of the Great Seal of Scotland granting the Office of Her Majesty's Solicitor General for Scotland to David William Robert Brand, Esquire QC.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958.

Viz.:—The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 7) Order 1970

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporarily exempt from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2 shall continue to be exempt from import duty, both until 1st January 1971, except for items for which an earlier day is specified.

The Order also continues until 1st January 1971 the partial exemption for photographic film base of cellulose acetate.

The Order comes into operation on 2nd July and has been published as Statutory Instrument 1970 No. 934.

Viz.:—The Import Duties (General) (No. 4) Order 1970

This Order reduces the full rate of duty on certain synthetic fatty alcohols from twenty per cent to ten per cent ad valorem.

Road Haulage Wages Council

THE Road Haulage Wages Council hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Road Haulage) Order 1969 (Order R.H. (90)) as amended by the Wages Regulation (Road Haulage) (Amendment) Order 1970 Order R.H. (92)); and (2) the revocation of Order RH (90) and Order R.H. (92).
