

POST OFFICE TELECOMMUNICATIONS TELEX SERVICE

THE Post Office hereby gives notice that telex service will become available from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to Burma on 10th August 1970.

The charges on and from 10th August 1970 for telex calls made from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to Burma are shown below. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with regulation 2(2) and regulation 9 of the Telex Regulations 1965 (in force as schemes under the Post Office Act 1969) and may be revised at any time by the Post Office.

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES

Different rates of interest apply according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

REPORT BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES PAY AND PRODUCTIVITY IN THE WATER SUPPLY INDUSTRY.

1. ON 23rd January 1970, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Minister of Housing and Local Government referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and report the pay, pay structure and productivity of the Water Supply Industry in Great Britain.

2. The Board has now made its report, and in accordance with Section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, the Secretary of State for Scotland, and the Minister of Housing and Local Government hereby give notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 4434 on 4th August 1970.
