- The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated: Cattle plague or rinderpest (*pestis-bovina*) 1877; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*) 1906; glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928; parasitic mange (*psoroptes et sarcoptes scabiei equi*), 1948; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1866; and sheep scab (*scabies ovium*), 1952. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.
- The last confirmed case of swine fever was in June 1956 and the disease is now regarded as eradicated from Great Britain.
- No bovine animal was slaughtered as an "affected" animal within the meaning of Article 3 of the Tuberculosis Order 1964, during the period of 1st January to 31st December 1970.
