WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades
Wages Council (Great Britain)

THE Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Secretary of State for Employment proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear) Order 1970 (Order R.D.O. (54)) and (2) the revocation of Order R.D.O. (54). Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notice R.D.O. (55) which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals if made to it within 14 days from 22nd January 1971. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Retail Drapery, Outfitting and Footwear Trades Wages Council (Great Britain), 12 St. James's Square, London S.W.1.
